What is Truth?

A righteous and just God would reveal Himself and His Truth to His creation and give them the knowledge and understanding of His Creative Laws. Throughout the history of man, God revealed His Laws and Promises to men and women who were true worshippers and followers of His commandments.

During the Middle Ages, between the 6th to 15th centuries, the Pope and the leaders of the Catholic church forbid the English translation of the preserved writings of the prophets of Israel and the disciples of Jesus Christ. The sentence was death.

In 1604 God inspired King James to create and establish a standard English translation that would preserve the historical writings for future generations. King James carefully selected 47 scholars who were members of the Church of England for this monumental task. They carefully studied and organized over 5400 manuscripts in Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic which had been preserved in Antioch, then translated them into English for the common man.
